ALLIED EDUCATOR

As part of the school's effort to promote integration and inclusivity of our students with students in mainstream schools, we have an opening for the position of an **ALLIED EDUCATOR**.

Your job role will include (but not limited to):-

- **Behaviour and Learning Support**
 - Facilitate and implement purposeful and appropriate integration activities of students in their satellite schools by:
 - Planning and monitoring integration activities conducted in the satellite schools
 - Coordinating and implementing activities for physical and academic and/or social interaction with pupils from SPED and mainstream schools
 - Providing additional support for behavior and learning of students during integration activities
- **Capacity Building**
 - Fostering good communication with school leaders and key stakeholders (eg: teachers, students, parents) about the intent and purpose of satellite schools
 - Conduct awareness talks to mainstream school staff, parents and students on special needs and support actions
 - Implement professional sharing sessions between SPED school teachers and mainstream school teachers
- **Administrative Duties**
 - Managing financial, logistical and operational requirements of the satellite
 - Maintain database of satellite students in mainstream partner school.
 - Set up and maintain special needs friendly classroom and school environment
 - Providing updates to MOE on status and effectiveness of integration.

It is crucial that you possess:

- At least a Bachelor's degree from a reputable university and 2 years of relevant work experience
- Good administrative and relational skills
- Good command of verbal and written English
- Good organizational skills with strong detail orientation
- Ability to work in a team and independently
- Ability to work in a fast paced, dynamic and challenging work environment
- A genuine desire to serve the students in the special needs community.
